
President's Message...


WHAT BOTTLE? THIS IS OUR HISTORY

Abraham B. Mortley was a Utica businessman in 1855, what was his occupation?



ONEITA SPRING WATER BOTTLES

Club Member Acquires Very Rare Bottles

MVABC member Kevin Britton recently acquired four rare olive green, blob-top labeled **ONEITA SPRING WATER** bottles ca 1885 - 1905. The bottles have no embossing, labels only.

A while back, Kevin attended an auction in Hubbardsville, NY. After the auction Keven was in the barn looking around and found a wooden bushel basket with bottles in it. Four of the bottles in the bushel basket were the four Oneita Spring Water bottles. Two of the labels were in pretty good shape with a few minor nicks. The two other examples had labels that were in very poor shape, with less than half of the labels left on the bottles. Kevin bought the bushel basket of bottles. People keep finding new stuff and that is what makes our hobby so interesting - as we say, "there's no end to it!"

There were two Oneita Springs in Oneida County during its' history. The first spring was in Verona, NY. Verona Springs in Verona had three springs and the Oneita was one of them. These springs were used early by native Oneida Indians. In 1837, an R. M. Bedle advertised in the June 27, 1837 issue of the *Utica Democrat* that he had taken over the Oneita Bath House in Verona, Oneida County, NY. If this water was ever bottled it is not known. Verona Mineral Water was bottled, but there are no known bottles that Central New York club members are aware of. Of course, it's possible a "closet collector," somewhere has one.


The other Oneita Spring was on Hickory Street in Utica, NY. Hickory Street no longer exists and is now part of Noyes Street, running west from the North/South Arterial by Spilka's Restaurant. The Utica Oneita Spring Water wasn't bottled until 1885. Oneita Mineral Water was marketed locally and became a very popular table water. It was also sold from New York City to Buffalo. Different people owned the Utica Oneita Spring Company during its history. The HB monogram shown below on the photo of the label may stand for Howarth & Ballard who were Utica druggists and may have sold the water at one time.








This rare photo of the Oneita Mineral Spring Company, Utica, NY was sold on Ebay a few years ago. The photo has "1886-1899" and "8-32 Hickory Street" hand written along the bottom. Notice the "SPRING HOUSE" sign near the center of the photo. Oneita Spring Water was bottled and sold throughout Central New York and from New York City to Buffalo. At one time the Ennis Bottling Works was the sole agent for the water and owned the Oneita Spring Company. A few years ago member Fred Capozzella wrote an article for our club's newsletter about the Ennis Bros. which included information about the Oneita Spring Company.

Utica. Utica, Feb. 12.—A deed was recorded yesterday by which Wm. R. Heath and wife and Frederick H. Heath and wife convey to the Oneita Spring Company the property on Hickory and Walnut streets, covering the site of the Oneita Springs, together with the business connected therewith; consideration, \$60,000.


THE BEAUTY OF GLASS



This very common half pint Utica whiskey flask is embossed FRED J. HARDING/211 -213 COLUMBIA ST./ONE BLOCK FROM/GENESEE ST./UTICA, N.Y. The flask was recently offered for sale on eBay. The high quality photo just happens to capture the "beauty of glass." The bottle is sparkling mint and the embossing is great. It does lack crudeness like some whittle marks (wavy rough lines) and some bubbles but the beautiful aqua color makes up for that.

Very Rare Pocket Flask WHITE'S HOTEL, ROME, NY


